Die Zeit der Handlung fällt mit dem Jahr 1430 in eine späte Phase des Hundertjährigen Krieges. Die Szenen wechseln zwischen verschiedenen Gegenden Frankreichs. Beim fraglichen Krieg handelte es sich nicht etwa um einen Konflikt zwischen bereits gefestigten Nationen, sondern um eine Auseinandersetzung zwischen großen Lehensverbänden, die in einer verflochtenen Verwandtschaftsbeziehung zueinander standen. König Karl IV. hatte keinen direkten männlichen Nachkommen hinterlassen und damit begann der Legitimationsstreit um die französische Krone. Als Johanna wirkte, war Frankreich in drei politische Räume aufgeteilt: Der Dauphin und spätere König Karl VII. wurde auf ein Gebiet südlich der Loire zurückgedrängt und Orléans lag somit direkt an der Front und wurde von den Engländern belagert. Herzog von Bedford regierte im Auftrag des englischen Königs, der auch den Titel König von Frankreich für sich beanspruchte, über die Normandie, Bretagne, Champagne, Paris und die Guyenne. Philipp der Gute von Burgund schließlich, herrschte über Burgund, die Freigrafschaft Burgund und Teile von Flandern. Friedrich von Schiller (1759-1805), 1802 geadelt, war ein Arzt, Dichter, Philosoph und Historiker. Er gilt als einer der bedeutendsten deutschsprachigen Dramatiker, Lyriker und Essayisten.

Excerpt from Schillers Jungfrau Von Orleans: Eine Romantische Tragödie French at Crecy (1345) and Poitiers the first phase of that war had ended in the Peace of Bretigny (1360) by which the captive French King, John II, ceded to Edward III a large section of Southwestern France. This lost territory was indeed regained subsequently by Charles V, but with his death in 1380 and the accession of Charles VI, a child of twelve, internal dissensions, fostered by partisans of his brother, Louis of Orleans, and later by the intemperate passions of his wife, Isabeau of Bavaria, greatly weakened the forces of order. After 1392, the king became subject to periods of insanity, and John the Fearless Duke of Burgundy, was able to gain possession of the reins of government in the northern provinces while Louis with the help of Queen Isabeau dominated the South.' Anarchy and oppression followed. In 1407 partisans of the Duke of Burgundy assassinated Louis, but the Southern party under the leadership of Count d'armagnac gained control of Paris. Then Burgundy appealed to England. This gave Henry IV an opportunity to reassert the shadowy claims abandoned at the Peace of Bretigny. His more daring successor, Henry V, invaded Normandy and in 1415 gained a great victory at Agincourt. Then Isabeau, who had been banished from the court of her son, then Dauphin and afterward Charles VII, made common cause with Burgundy, who, secure in the benevolent neutrality of Henry V, gained control of Paris by treachery. The English having captured Rouen, the Dauphin in desperation began negotiations with the Duke of Burgundy, but while these were pending the Duke was murdered by some partisan who thus avenged the death of Louis of Orleans. This seemed to the duke's son and successor, Philip, afterward known as The Good, a valid excuse for joining Isabeau in negotiating with Henry the treaty of Troyes by which the English king was declared regent of France during the life of the mad Charles VI and heir to his throne.
