During that time he received the commission for Chandigarh -- a mandate to create an entirely new capital to house the government of the recently created state of Punjab. The next year, he began working on projects for two villas and the Millowners' Building at Ahmedabad. All ten original notebooks record Le Corbusier's reaction to this exotic and complex culture, his interest in its vernacular architecture, and his preoccupation with environmental control through architectural design. They demonstrate how he converted new experiences into unique and very

personal designs. They also record his bitter disappointment at being excluded from work on the United Nations building in New York.These sketchbooks also document the years when Le Corbusier transformed his strict, glass-and-metal International Style into aggressively sculptural forms. Here are the initial drawings for this changing sensibility: the Unité d'habitation at Marseille (1947-1952), and the revolutionary pilgrimage chapel at Ronchamp (1950-1954).

In 1929, Eileen Gray designed Villa E 1027 for herself and her youthful partner Jean Badovici, but only lived there for three years. Today, the elegant house in Roquebrune-Cap-Martin in southern France is an icon of modernism. In 1937, Le Corbusier discovered the place and the "Maison en Bord de Mer". Inspired by the genius of the place and the light on the Côte d'Azur, he created a total of eight large-format wall paintings there in 1938 and 1939 onwards, some of which complement the building congenially, while others set counterpoints. In 1952, he built his Cabanon nearby and decorated it with murals as well. The book by the well-known architectural historian Tim Benton documents Le Corbusier's artwork at this special place, explores its controversies, and places it in his overall oeuvre. The fascinating photographs by Manuel Bougot capture the special atmosphere of the villa Le Corbusier's painting is lesser known but was formative for his lifelong preoccupation with polychromy After extensive renovation work until 2021, E 1027, as well as the Cabanon, is open to the public again

At Cap Martin on the French Riviera, there is a fascinating place for anyone interested in art, design and architecture, a heritage site fashioned by three totally different personalities - Eileen Gray, Thomas Rebutato and Le Corbusier - now inextricably linked to one another by History. In 1927 the Irish furniture designer Eileen Gray, at the dawn of a new architectural home, bought a plot of land on which, with Jean Badovici, she was to build her holiday home, enigmatically called "E-1027". Twenty years later a plumber from Nice, Thomas Rebutato by name, came to live on the site next to E-1027 and opened a modest snack bar called the Etoile de Mer. One of his first customers was a certain Le Corbusier, a friend of Jean Badovici's. This wooden cabin was to be his holiday home until he died.
