Christopher Columbus returned to Europe in the final days of 1500, ending his third voyage to the Indies not in triumph but in chains. Seeking to justify

his actions and protect his rights, he began to compile biblical texts and excerpts from patristic writings and medieval theology in a manuscript known as the Book of Prophecies. This unprecedented collection was designed to support his vision of the discovery of the Indies as an important event in the process of human salvation - a first step

toward the liberation of Jerusalem and the Holy Land from Muslim domination. This work is part of a twelve-volume series produced by U.C.L.A.'s Center for Medieval and Renaissance Studies which involved the collaboration of some forty scholars over the course of fourteen years. In this volume of the series, Roberto Rusconi has written a complete historical introduction to the Book of Prophecies, describing the manuscript's history and analyzing its principal themes. His edition of the documents, the only modern one, includes a complete critical apparatus and detailed commentary, while the facing-page English translations allow Columbus's work to be appreciated by the general public and scholars alike.

Por su importante participación en la repatriación a Austria del cadáver y los soldados del difunto Emperador Maximiliano de México, fue condecorado por el Emperador Francisco José de Austria como Caballero de la Orden de la Corona de Hierro de Tercera Clase. Siendo Cónsul de Dinamarca por casi 50 años, primero en Veracruz y luego en la Ciudad de México, fue condecorado por el Rey de Dinamarca como Caballero de la Orden del Dannebrog. Lo que hace

muy especial a la familia Wiechers es la cantidad descomunal de información, documentación, recuerdos y tradiciones orales que de los hermanos fundadores han conservado o recuperado sus descendientes o los amigos de éstos. Todo ello nos ha permitido reconstruir la historia, no sólo de una familia en particular, sino de toda una época, de un México y una Europa que, desgraciadamente, ya se esfumaron.

The product of five years' investigative reporting, the subject of intense national controversy, and the source of death

threats that forced the National Human Rights Commission to assign two full-time bodyguards to its author, Anabel Hernández, *Narcoland* has been a publishing and political sensation in Mexico. The definitive history of the drug cartels, *Narcoland* takes readers to the front lines of the “war on drugs,” which has so far cost more than 60,000 lives in just six years.
