Jonas Lüscher's second novel, *Kraft*, is a hilarious and wicked tale about a man facing the ruins of his life, and his world.

Winner of the German Book Prize, *The Capital* is an "omniscient, almost Balzac-ian" (Steven Erlanger, *New York Times*) panorama of splintered Europe. A highly inventive novel of ideas written in the rich European tradition, *The Capital*—epic in scope, but so particular in details—transports readers to the cobblestoned streets of twenty-first-century Brussels. Chosen as the European Union's symbolic capital in 1958 for no reason other than Belgium coming first alphabetically, this elusive setting has never been examined so intricately in literature. Here, in Robert Menasse's "great EU novel" (*Politico*), tragic heroes, clever schemers, and involuntary accomplices play out the effects of a fiercely nationalistic "union." Recalling the Balzacian conceit of assembling a vast parade of characters whose lives conspire to form a driving central plot, Menasse adapts this technique with modern sensibility to reveal the hastily assembled capital in all of its eccentricities. We meet, among others, Fenia Xenopoulou, a Greek Cypriot recently "promoted" to the Directorate-General for Culture. When tasked with revamping the boring image of the European Commission with the Big Jubilee Project, she endorses her Austrian assistant Martin Sussman's idea to proclaim Auschwitz as its birthplace—of course, to the horror of the other nation states. Meanwhile, Inspector Émile Brunfaut attempts to solve a gritty murder being suppressed at the highest level; Matek, a Polish hitman who regrets having never become a priest, scrambles after taking out the wrong man; and outraged pig farmers protest trade restrictions as a brave escapee squeals through the streets. These narratives and more are masterfully woven, revealing the absurdities—and real dangers—of a fracturing Europe. A tour de force from one of Austria's most esteemed novelists, *The Capital* is a mordantly funny and piercingly urgent saga of the European Union, and an aerial feat of sublime world literature.

**Carolus Stuardus** Mondial

Set during the height of World War II, a powerful and unsettling tale about a woodcutter and his wife, who finds a mysterious parcel thrown from a passing train. Once upon a time in an enormous forest lived a woodcutter and his wife. The woodcutter is very poor and a war rages around them, making it difficult for them to put food on the table. Yet every night, his wife prays for a child. A Jewish father rides on a train holding twin babies. His wife no longer has enough milk to feed both children. In hopes of saving them both, he wraps his daughter in a shawl and throws her into the forest. While foraging for food, the wife finds a bundle, a baby girl wrapped in a shawl. Although she knows harboring this baby could lead to her death, she takes the child home. Set against the horrors

of the Holocaust and told with a fairytale-like lyricism, *The Most Precious of Cargoes* is a fable about family and redemption which reminds us that humanity can be found in the most inhumane of places. Translated from the French by Frank Wynne

The city is crowded with double agents and soldiers, and wracked by protests and poverty, while across the border, Pyongyang grows more prosperous by the day. Might a homecoming to North Korea be his only hope for salvation?

Christian Fürchtegott Gellert (1715-1769) war ein deutscher Dichter und Moralphilosoph der Aufklärung und galt zu Lebzeiten neben Christian Felix Weiße als meistgelesener deutscher Schriftsteller. Seine Werke - besonders seine Fabeln - zählten in der Übergangszeit zwischen Aufklärung, Empfindsamkeit und Sturm und Drang zu den meistgelesenen in Deutschland. Durch seine breite Wirkung trug er zur Bildung eines allgemeinen Lesepublikums in Deutschland bei und ebnete so den Weg für die Dichter der folgenden Generationen. Seine Lustspiele brachten erstmals bürgerliche Figuren und deren Milieu auf die Bühnen; der Roman *Leben der schwedischen Gräfin von G\*\*\** hatte die Ethik bürgerlicher Moral zum Gegenstand und war Wegbereiter des Romans in Deutschland. Aus dem Buch: "Als ich mich den Morgen darauf noch mit dem Grafen beratschlagte, was wir unserm Paare heute für ein Vergnügen machen wollten, trat ein Bedienter herein und sagte, daß ein Engelländer meinen Gemahl sprechen wollte. Sobald er die Tür öffnete, so sagte uns sein Gesicht, daß es Steeleys Vater wäre. Er hatte ein eisgraues Haupt; aber seine muntern Augen, sein rotes Gesicht und trotziger Gang widerlegten seine Haare. »Ich suche«, fing er auf französisch an, »meinen Sohn bei Ihnen; oder da ich in meinem Leben wohl nicht so glücklich sein werde, ihn wiederzusehen: so will ich wenigstens hören, ob Sie nicht wissen, wo er ist. "

Hans Kelsen is widely recognized as one of the most important legal theorists of the 20th century.

Surprisingly, however, his political writings are not nearly as widely known as his legal theory, especially in the English-speaking world. This book fills the void between what is and isn't known about Hans Kelsen's political philosophy, and the ways that philosophy has and will continue to shape political debates inherent to democracy in the future. For the first time in English, this classic book - with an introduction by political theorist Nadia Urbinati - provides an overview of Kelsen's career and his contributions to 20th century political thought.

Man ist entzückt von Sprachspielen, den schnellen Haikus, einem Winterliebeslied und einem Schokoladenladengedicht. Es gibt kein Recht auf Heiterkeitsverzicht, davon war Wlglaf Droste überzeugt, und so balanciert die Heiterkeit die Melancholie in Tisch und Bett aus, und wir lesen diese letzten Gedichte als eine Hommage an das Leben.

Previous studies of Wagner's operas have tended to approach the works as chunks of autobiography, philosophical speculations or historical-political comments on the age in which they were written. Professor Dahlhaus dissociated himself from all such ventures.
